

"We have to get up by four in the morning so that we can meet our boat taxi. This will take us to the ports where the jungle villages are nearby." So, we got up at the crack of dawn and sat in our seats next to clucking chickens and banana bunches until the boat finally took off.

Seeing the mist come off the river and glow in the sunrise was beautiful, yet nothing prepared me for the beauty to be found in all the believers at each village gathering for worship to hear the word of God. Creation glorifies God in its wonder, yet it was His people who opened their mouths in their own languages to praise God for what Christ had done for them.

Every church we visited in Peru and Chile produced this joy in me! Despite miles of separation, different living conditions, and a whole other language, we were united in confession of Jesus Christ the Son of God.

It was a refreshing reminder that the Gospel knows no bounds, nor can it be restrained. God's Word breaks through; it is the reality of His Word taking effect just as He wills and said it would, "Turn to me and be saved, the ends of the earth! For I am God, and there is no other. By myself I have sworn, from my mouth has gone out in

righteousness a word that shall not return: 'To me every knee shall bow, every tongue shall swear allegiance'" (Isa 45:23).

## News From Other Mission Fields

## How Can You Help?

**PERU**—Political turmoil continues to affect our work in Peru. On occasion, blockades prevent essential items from entering the capital of Lima. Sometimes, it is impossible for the pastors to leave Lima to travel to other church locations.

**CHILE**—The training of one man for ministry continues through online instruction. Pastor Mario Gálvez will present a paper at the June international convention of the Confessional Evangelical Lutheran Conference in Seoul, South Korea, on equipping lay members for evangelism.

**INDIA**—The pastors are continuing their work in reaching out to the villages. The leaders have begun the final year of studies for the current class of seminary students. Several building projects are ready to be completed that will provide homes for worship and will help in the training of future workers.

NOTE: The above building projects require over \$160,000. One congregation recently gave \$80,000 for these projects as a "challenge gift". Can you help provide for the remaining \$80,000 to complete these projects?

**KOREA**—The church body is preparing for the triennial convention of the Confessional Evangelical Lutheran Conference to take place in Seoul the first week of June. As many as 34 Lutheran church bodies from around the world—all of them in doctrinal agreement with the ELS—may be represented.

**LATVIA**—Three men continue their seminary studies. Work continues with a new evangelism and apologetics center in a historic part of Old Town Riga.

**CZECHIA**—School activities are underway at Martin Luther School in Pilsen. Pastor Petr Krakora continues to explore other outreach opportunities.

**UKRAINE**—Administrators Nick and Kerry Laper plan to return to Ukraine in March. All counseling centers are open and providing services. The medical and dental mobile clinics offer their services from the winter garage. Although the war with Russia is a challenge for the work of Gift of Life, the Lord continues to bless this work for his glory and the blessing of many.

Pray for each of the mission fields, for the national pastors of these churches as well as for the members of their congregations to remain faithful in their homelands that often do not welcome the Gospel of Jesus Christ. May God work all these challenges for the good of his people, as he has promised.
