A Historical Register, 1918–2023



Preface

Over one hundred years ago, an ambitious project was undertaken to publish a three-volume set of books recounting the work of Norwegian Lutherans in North America.

In 1918, a two-book directory was published with the title, *Norsk Lutherske Menigheter i Amerika*, 1843–1916. These books comprise a record of 6,754 Norwegian Lutheran congregations which existed in North America. The information, while limited by the information and accuracy of that which was submitted to the compiler, has been vital for historical purposes of the past century.

Previously the first volume in the series had been published in 1914, pertaining to the Norwegian Lutheran clergy under the title *Norsk Lutherske prester i Amerika*, 1843–1913. It included the biographies of 1,826 pastors and was revised in 1928 as *Who's Who Among Pastors in All the Norwegian Lutheran Synods of America*, 1843–1927.

A third volume was *School Calendar*, 1824–1924: a who's who among teachers in the Norwegian Lutheran synods of America, which listed 3,600 names.

In the preface to the final volume, the compiler of the series, the Rev. O. M. Norlie, writes, "It is profitable for any race group to sit down at times to take an inventory of what it has given and what it has received."

The Evangelical Lutheran Synod considers herself to be the rightful spiritual successor of the Norwegian Synod. As such, this historical directory is prepared after the manner of the above works. The scope is more limited, pertaining only to the congregations, pastors, and teachers who have been members of the Evangelical Lutheran Synod and served within her congregations. Additional earlier historical data also is included for congregations and pastors finding their origins within the Norwegian Synod.

The historical record of some congregations is short. The record of other congregations is long. Some congregations are young while others are well aged. Some congregations have a simple history while others are more complex. As with its predecessors, accuracy is limited to the information available. Yet, this is the heritage of God's history and working to extend His kingdom on earth.

May this volume also serve as a resource for the coming decades.

Lake Mills Lutheran Church

Lake Mills, Iowa

ELS 1919-

Organized 1865. Reorganized 1918. 85 souls in 1930; 134 in 1950; 150 in 1975; 68 in 2000; 18 in 2020.

Worship services among the Norwegians were conducted in the Lake Mills area as early as 1865 by the Rev. T. A. Torgerson. After early doctrinal divisions, a congregation, Our Savior's, was organized in 1889. When this congregation entered into the Merger, Lake Mills Lutheran Church was reorganized by a minority. In 1921 the former church building, constructed in 1895, was repurchased. A new entrance was added in 1967. The nave and exterior were

remodeled and rededicated on October 15, 1972.


