had a total of On October 15, 1994, the church was dedicated and we began ministry at St. John's, the headquarters in 184 baptisms Hyderabad. At that time, we had one Christian family, Pastor Solomon's family, with a two-year-old child and a nine-month-old baby girl. One Christian family and 95% of confirmations... the members were idol followers.

They knew nothing. They were all in darkness, in bondage, far away from

the truth. Their hearts filled with fear, they never knew grace and salvation. In such a situation, the Lord shined His Light and brought these people from darkness to light and showed His deeds are marvelous and worthy to be praised. Today, 100% of the members are baptized in Christ who now lives and rules our hearts, now and forever.

Note Several building projects in India are ready to be completed that will provide homes for worship and will help in the training of future workers. These projects require over \$160,000. One congregation recently gave \$80,000 for these projects as a "challenge gift". Can you help provide for the remaining \$80,000 to complete these projects? News From Other Mission Fields

Chile Pastor Mario Gálvez presented his paper on equipping lay members for evangelism at the June international convention of the Confessional Evangelical Lutheran Conference in Seoul, South Korea. It was well received and generated interesting discussion by pastors from various world churches.

Korea The pastors continue to look for outreach opportunities. Pastor David Choi is especially engaged in finding ways to reach out to the Mandarin-speaking Koreans in and around Seoul.

Australia, will become an official field under the BWO at this year's synod convention in June.

Latvia Four men are now enrolled in seminary studies. Pastor Ugis Sildegs presented his doctrinal paper on civil government and the church at the June international convention of the Confessional Evangelical Lutheran Conference in Seoul, South Korea.

Czech Republic Summer activities, like VBS (Vacation Bible School), are underway at Martin Luther School in Pilsen.

Ukraine Administrators Nick and Kerry Laper returned to the U.S. for several months to regroup and plan for future work with Gift of Life. They continue to focus on finding an administrator to replace the Lapers when they retire within the next twelve months. All counseling centers are open and providing services. The medical and dental mobile clinics are on the road offering their services. Although the war with Russia is a challenge for the work of Gift of Life, the Lord continues to bless this work for his glory and the blessing of many.
