My childhood hero was Davy, Davy Crockett. Therefore, March 6th has always been a notable day for me to "Remember the Alamo!" Those of you from Texas also commemorate this event since it was a battle that in part bought time for General Sam Houston to muster his army for the eventual showdown at San Jacinto against the weakened army of General Santa Anna.

Christians in the United States today have been observing an ongoing assault upon the freedoms to practice our religion as directed by our Lord.
