

The 2023 Bethany Lutheran College (BLC) spring semester commencement ceremony was held on Friday, May 12. Ninety-five graduates received their bachelor of arts, bachelor of science in nursing, and for the first time in the history of the institution, a master of arts in clinical mental health counseling degrees.

Dr. Joshua Mears was speaker. Mears attended Bethany and graduated in 2005 with a degree in psychology and a minor in religious studies. Mears has served Bethany as an



adjunct faculty member both for the Bethany Seminary and for the Clinical Mental Health Counseling program. He has also served as a member of the Board of Regents at Bethany since 2017.
