Greetings in the name of Christ who calls His pastors to continue to study and learn from the Holy Scriptures and thereby benefit His holy people!

In reading a unique book on evangelism, I came upon this encouragement for congregations I thought worth sharing here.

"Let congregations ensure that they give their pastors plenty of time to study the Scriptures. St. Paul charges Timothy, 'Until I come, devote yourself to the public reading of Scripture, to exhortation, to teaching ... Attend to these things, be in these things, in order that your progress may be manifest to all. Keep a close watch on yourself and on the teaching. Remain in them, for by doing this you will save both yourself and your hearers' (1 Tim. 4:13, 15-16).

"And how does a congregation help a pastor study Scriptures? Seek to relieve him of administrative tasks or excessive meetings that would distract him from the duties God has given him. Let the elders ask the pastor regularly what he's reading, and what he's learning. Make sure the pastor has the means to acquire good books and attend continuing education classes."


