A while back, the Board for World Outreach together with the Board for Christian Service put out an appeal to the members of the ELS requesting special offerings to help with COVID, medical, and flood relief in our world mission fields. Your response has been overwhelming. Even now, the need for help continues.

In this issue, we have a heart-warming letter of thanks from Rajahmundry in India. We have been told that in Rajahmundry, several Bible Women and Gospel Workers, three seminary students and five out of seven board members became COVID victims. District President Ananda Raju died from the virus. Two seminary students survived bad road accidents. Two photos show President Raju, while he was still alive, administering relief even while he was aware of the danger he was facing. *You may see some of these people in the photos in this issue.*

We also have updates from other fields where the coronavirus has caused more hardship.

As always, we appreciate your prayers for the work in our world fields and your financial support that makes this work possible. The Bible passage below was quoted last summer as the COVID effects became known. It still applies today.

## News From Other Mission Fields

- *Peru*—COVID-19 has surged once again. In-person worship is not allowed but online video services are being presented.
- *Chile*—The churches are restricted from in-person worship once again, but online worship is available and watched, not only by church members, but by others not currently members of the congregations. The training of future church workers continues.
- *South Korea*—There are still travel restrictions and quarantine requirements. The BWO is planning for a seminary graduate to serve at Seoul Lutheran Church. Pray that the visa process goes smoothly.
- *Latvia*—The churches are again under quarantine after a new surge in the coronavirus. Plans are underway to start a new evangelism center in a historic part of the capital, Old Town Riga.
- *Czech Republic*—A recent offering for relief was gathered and sent to a congregation in Peru. The story appeared in the latest issue of the "Thoughts of Faith" newsletter.
- *Ukraine*—Administrators Nick and Kerry Laper have returned to Ukraine after several months of being back in the United States. The counseling centers and medical clinics look forward to being open and offering services. Plans are underway for upgrades and purchase of new equipment for the clinics.

## In Other News

- *Kenya*—A new class of seminary students will begin classes in March. This new church body continues to develop its organization.

- *Pray* for each of the mission fields, for the national pastors of these churches as well as for the members of their congregations to remain faithful in their homelands that often do not welcome the Gospel of Jesus Christ.
