NEWS From Other Mission Fields

- **Peru** Our brothers and sisters in Peru are facing some very difficult challenges. Attempts (unsuccessful) have been made to undermine and supplant the Peru leadership. Gangs have threatened the work at Martin Luther School with mafia-like "protection" schemes. Pray for the Lord's guidance, protection and mercy.
- **Korea** Seoul Lutheran Church is strategizing to reach new members and reverse a loss in membership as the congregation ages. Pastor David Choi at Great Light Lutheran Church is gaining new members. He is also working with some non-Lutheran pastors who want to learn more about Lutheran doctrine and may be interested in further advanced studies.
- **India** Seminary training continues. Plans are being made for outreach through health fairs and VBS.
- **Australia** Our Redeemer Lutheran Church in Brisbane, Australia, will be welcoming their new pastor, Skyler Hepler, in August.
- **Latvia** Seminary teaching continues with two men enrolled in seminary studies. New outreach opportunities are being explored. A 100-year-old building continues being renovated as the church home of a mission congregation in Jelgava.
- **Czech Republic** The BWO continues to evaluate the status of St. Paul's congregation and Martin Luther School in Pilsen. Pastor Martin Vrsecky serves the congregation part-time while he manages and teaches religion at Martin Luther School.
- **Ukraine (Gift of Life)** Administrator Dmytro Maksymenko continues developing and promoting new ways of Gospel outreach through the pregnancy counseling centers and mobile clinics. Although the war with Russia is a challenge for the work of Gift of Life, the Lord continues to bless this work for his glory and the blessing of many. Dmytro and his daughter Mariya were recently confirmed as members of Mount Olive Lutheran Church in Mankato, Minnesota.
